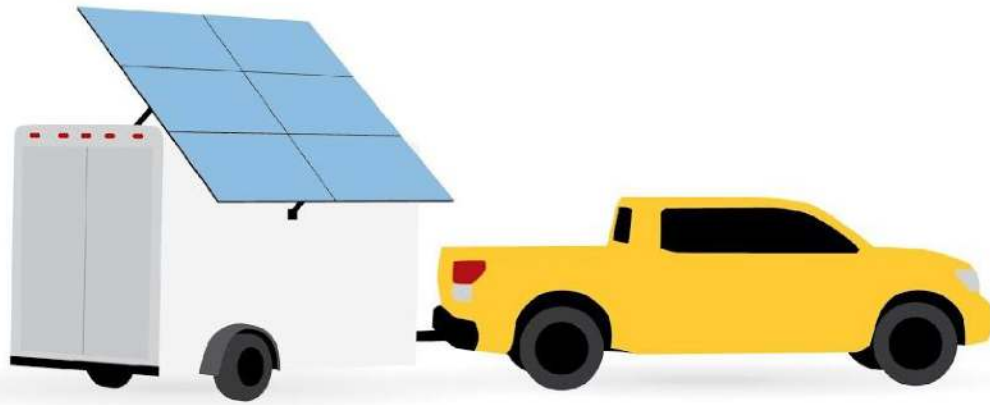


“The aftermath of Hurricane Maria has been even harder than the path of the storm itself, especially for those communities in the interior of the island. After more than a month, reestablishment of electric power for those communities is still unknown, and the quality of water is not the best - for those communities that are lucky enough to have this service. THE SOLAR OUTREACH SYSTEMS OFFER:

- **LIGHT.** Floodlights create a community gathering space once the sun has set.
- **CHARGING POWER.** 15 lockers, each with two USB ports and an electrical outlet, allow families to bring cell phones, laptops, even small appliances to be charged.
- **CLEAN WATER.** Each SOS includes a 5 gallon water filter that can clean 500 gallons per day.

WHO WILL THESE SERVE?

Communities in Puerto Rico that will be least and last served by other aid.

"Community members are watching FEMA trucks drive past, bringing aid to the larger communities. It's these stranded communities where we'll be bringing the solar units." Joni Zweig, Amurtel Executive Director.

PROJECT GOAL:

Deliver 100 units to Puerto Rico beginning December 2017. To build the first 10 units, we're working to raise \$200,000 in monetary and equipment donations.

Amurtel is a non-profit working internationally to bring aid to those affected by disasters.
